

Health and Safety at Shalom Farms

Thank you so much for your interest in volunteering with us. In order to ensure the safety of our staff, volunteers and visitors, we are taking the following precautions on our farm sites:

- Group sizes may be limited to ensure our ability to safely distance volunteers in the field.
- While our hope is to safely accommodate everyone, scheduling preference will be given to volunteers that are able to commit to helping us on a regular or routine basis. Doing this can help with contact tracing and allows us to more easily enforce safety protocols.
- All volunteers and visitors will be encouraged to maintain a 6ft distance from others, unless they are part of the same household.
- If a situation arises where social distancing is not possible (ex: lifting something heavy with the help of another volunteer), mask wearing will be strongly encouraged.
- All volunteers are required to carry a mask on their person for the duration of their shift.
- All volunteers must wash their hands for a full 20 seconds before beginning their shift.
- All volunteers must sign a COVID screening form upon arrival to confirm the absence of relevant symptoms.
- Volunteers will be expected to follow tool sanitization guidelines as instructed by staff.
- All volunteers will be encouraged to check their temperature at home before heading to the farm. A temperature of 100.4 or higher is considered a fever.

We ask that all potential volunteers self-assess their risk of both contracting and spreading COVID-19 based on their own health history, age, work/school requirements, and other daily activities. If you feel that your presence at the farm poses a health risk to either yourself or others, please stay home. There will be other opportunities to work together in the future.
